1. Begin by reading the Scripture for this week's message, Luke 24:1-48.
2. Jot down any words, phrases, questions, or insights that jumped out at you when reading this passage. Has anything new come to mind since yesterday's message?

## Getting into the Word

1. When the women came to the tomb to embalm Jesus' body, the angels who were there reminded them that Jesus had taught them He would rise again. Read two times that Jesus spoke this to His disciples, in Matthew 16:21-23 and Matthew 17:22-23.
  - a) Why were the disciples so distraught about this teaching during His ministry? What were they focusing on?
  - b) List the people in our passage (Luke 24:1-48) who were still troubled in their hearts and did not fully grasp that He would rise after His death?
2. The resurrection of Jesus Christ from death to life changed everything. It became the core of evangelism that the Messiah was no longer some future promise but a historical fact that He had come in the person of Jesus Christ.
  - a) Read from Acts 2:22-36. What did Peter emphasize as the difference between David and Jesus?
  - b) Read from 1 Corinthians 15:12-19. Why is the resurrection of Jesus so critically important for the Gospel of salvation?
  - c) Read from 1 John 5:10-13. What is the key point in John's focus on the testimony of salvation?
